FINAL ORDER

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WHEREAS, a written petition, in due form and containing the required signatures, has been presented to and filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Greece, Monroe County, New York, for the establishment of Extension No. 532-7 to Sanitary Sewer District No. 1 in the Town of Greece, Monroe County, New York, (hereinafter, "the Sewer District"), consisting of the construction of a sanitary sewer system, including incidental improvements, at a maximum estimated cost of \$210,000, pursuant to Article 12 of the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, an order was duly adopted by this Town Board on the 16th day of March 2010, reciting the filing of said petition, the fact that said petition was on file in the Town Clerk's office, the improvement proposed, the boundaries of the proposed Sewer District and the estimated expense thereof and specifying the 13th day of April 2010, at 6:30 o'clock in the P.M., Prevailing Time, of that day at the Town Hall, One Vince Tofany Boulevard, in Rochester, New York, in said Town, as the time and place where the Town Board would meet for the purpose of holding a public hearing to consider the petition and the question of establishing said proposed Sewer District, and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing was duly posted and published in the manner and within the time prescribed by Section 193 of the Town Law and proof of said publication and posting has been presented to this Town Board; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held by this Town Board at the time and place set forth in the aforesaid order, and considerable discussion upon the matter having been had and all persons desiring to be heard were duly heard; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2010 the Town Board adopted a resolution finding in the affirmative all of the determinations required by Section 194 of the Town Law and approving the establishment of said Extension No. 532-7 to Sanitary Sewer District No. 1 in accordance with the provisions of Section 194 of the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, an application for permission to establish said Extension No. 532-7 to Sanitary Sewer District No. 1 was filed in the office of the State Department of Audit and Control at Albany, New York, in accordance with Section 194 of the Town Law for permission to establish such District; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Comptroller of the State of New York reviewed the application submitted for the proposed extension and made the following finding:

1. That the public interest will be served by the establishment of Extension No. 532-7 to Sanitary Sewer District No. 1 in the Town of Greece in accordance with such application.
2. That the cost of the proposed extension will not be an undue burden upon the property therein; and

WHEREAS, based on this determination, the Office of Comptroller of the State of New York has approved the establishment of said Extension 532-7 to Sanitary Sewer District No. 1 in accordance with the description referred to herein, at a cost not to exceed \$210,000; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to adopt a final order establishing the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED, by the Town Board of the Town of Greece, Monroe County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The establishment of Extension No. 532-7 to Sanitary Sewer District No. 1 in the Town of Greece and the construction of the improvements proposed therefore at a maximum estimated cost of \$210,000 are hereby approved. Said Sewer District shall be bounded and described as in Exhibit A attached hereto and hereby determined to be a part hereof. The method of financing the cost of said improvements shall be assessment in whole against the properties within the area of Extension 532-7. It is further determined that all real property within Extension 532-7 that will be assessed will be benefited by the proposed Extension 532-7, and no benefited property has been excluded.

Section 2. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be duly recorded in the office of the Clerk of Monroe County and filed in the office of the State Department of Audit and Control at Albany, New York, in the manner and within the time prescribed by Section 195(1) of the Town Law, being within ten days of adoption of this Order.

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Section 3. This order shall take effect immediately.

Vehicular access for the

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- Premises is via individual non-signalized driveways at Old Edgemere Drive and Wake Drive (two-lane Town of Greece streets).
2. Upon review of the Proposal, the Town Board has determined that the Proposal is subject to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617 et seq., the “SEQRA Regulations”) (collectively, “SEQRA”), and that the Proposal constitutes an Unlisted action under SEQRA.
 3. On August 17, 2010 at 6:32 p.m. in the Greece Town Hall, 1 Vince Tofany Boulevard, the Town Board held a public hearing (the “Hearing”) to consider the Proposal, at which time all persons and organizations in interest were heard.
 4. Documentary, testimonial, and other evidence relative to the Proposal were presented at the Hearing for the Town Board’s consideration.
 5. The Town Board carefully considered environmental information that was prepared by the Project Sponsor’s representatives for the Proposal (collectively, the “Environmental Analysis”), which included but was not limited to: a description of the Proposal; a Short Environmental Assessment Form; and conceptual site development plans.
 6. The Town Board carefully considered additional information submitted by the Project Sponsor’s representatives for the Proposal, including but not limited to: oral or written descriptions of the Proposal; maps of the Proposal; architectural elevations of the proposed single-family dwellings; and various oral or written comments that resulted from telephone conversations, meetings, or written correspondence from or with the Project Sponsor’s representatives.
 7. The Town Board carefully considered information, recommendations, and comments about the Proposal that resulted from telephone conversations, meetings, or written correspondence from or with various involved and interested agencies, including but not limited to: the Monroe County Department of Planning and Development; the Town of Greece Planning Board; the Town of Greece Environmental Board; and the Town’s own staff.
 8. The Town Board carefully has considered information, recommendations, and comments that resulted from telephone conversations, meetings, and written correspondence from or with nearby property owners, and all other comments submitted to the Town Board as of September 21, 2010.
 9. The Town Board has met the procedural and substantive requirements of SEQRA.
 10. The Town Board carefully considered each and every criterion for determining the potential significance of the Proposal upon the environment, as set forth in SEQRA.
 11. The Town Board carefully considered (that is, has taken the required “hard look” at) the Proposal and the relevant environmental impacts, facts, and conclusions disclosed in the Environmental Analysis and all additional information submitted.
 12. The Town Board concurs with the information and conclusions contained in the Environmental Analysis and all additional information submitted.
 13. The Town Board has made a reasoned elaboration of the rationale for arriving at its determination of environmental significance and the Town Board’s determination is supported by substantial evidence, as set forth herein.
 14. Consistent with social, economic, and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives available, the Proposal minimizes or avoids adverse environmental effects to the maximum extent practicable.
 15. To the maximum extent practicable, potential adverse environmental impacts revealed in the environmental review process will be avoided or minimized by the Project Sponsor’s voluntary incorporation of mitigation measures that were identified as practicable.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

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RESOLVED that, pursuant to SEQRA, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, and after examining the relevant issues, the Town Board's own initial concerns, and all relevant issues raised and recommendations offered by involved and interested agencies and the Town's own staff, the Town Board determines that the Proposal will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment, which constitutes a negative declaration.

3. On August 17, 2010 at 6:32 p.m. in the Greece Town Hall, 1 Vince Tofany Boulevard, the Town Board held a public hearing (the "Hearing") to consider the Proposal, at which time all persons and organizations in interest were heard.
4. Documentary, testimonial, and other evidence relative to the Proposal were presented at the Hearing for the Town Board's consideration.
5. The Town Board carefully considered waterfront consistency information that was prepared by the Applicant's representatives for the Proposal (collectively, the "Waterfront Consistency Analysis"), which included but was not limited to: a description of the Proposal; a short environmental assessment form; and conceptual site development plans.
6. In accordance with the WCRL, the Town Board caused a Coastal Assessment Form to be prepared and referred to the Town of Greece Planning Board (the "Planning Board") for review and recommendation regarding the consistency of proposed actions with the Town of Greece Local Waterfront Revitalization Program ("LWRP") policies and standards.
7. The Town Board carefully considered the Coastal Assessment Form.
8. The Town Board carefully considered additional information submitted by the Applicant's representatives for the Proposal, including but not limited to: oral or written descriptions of the Proposal; maps of the Proposal; architectural elevations of the proposed single-family dwellings; and various oral or written comments that resulted from telephone conversations, meetings, or written correspondence from or with the Applicant's representatives.
9. The Town Board carefully considered information, recommendations, and comments about the Proposal that resulted from telephone conversations, meetings, or written correspondence from or with various involved and interested agencies, including but not

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limited to: the Monroe County Department of Planning and Development; the Planning Board; the Town of Greece Environmental Board; and the Town's own staff.

10. The Town Board carefully considered information, recommendations, and comments that resulted from telephone conversations, meetings, and written correspondence from or with nearby property owners, and all other comments submitted to the Town Board as of September 21, 2010.
11. At its August 18, 2010, meeting, the Planning Board reviewed the Proposal and found it to be consistent with the LWRP policy standards and conditions, and recommended that the Town Board render a Determination of Consistency relative to the Proposal.
12. The Proposal is consistent with the following LWRP policies and standards, which are described in greater detail in the LWRP:
 - a. Revitalize the deteriorated and underutilized waterfront areas of the Town of Greece.
 - b. Ensure that development occurs where adequate public infrastructure is available.
 - c. Minimize flooding and erosion hazards.
 - d. Safeguard economic, social, and environmental interests in coastal areas.
13. On September 21, 2010, in accordance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8), and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617 et seq., the "SEQRA Regulations") (collectively, "SEQRA"), the Town Board issued a negative declaration for the environmental review of the Proposal (the "Negative Declaration"). The Negative Declaration indicated that, consistent with social, economic, and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives available, the Proposal minimizes or avoids adverse environmental effects to the maximum extent practicable, that potential adverse environmental effects will be minimized or avoided to the maximum extent practicable by the Applicant's voluntary incorporation of those mitigation measures that were identified as practicable, and that the Proposal will not have a significant adverse effect on the environment. The Negative Declaration is incorporated herein as findings of the Town Board in the decision on the determination of consistency of the Proposal.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, pursuant to the WCRL, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, and after examining the relevant issues, the Town Board's own initial concerns, and all relevant issues raised and recommendations offered by other agencies and the Town's own staff, the Town Board determines that the Proposal is consistent with the Town's LWRP policy standards and conditions, which constitutes a determination of consistency.

#266 - Councilman Morris offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, DBI Properties, Inc. (the "Applicant") has submitted a request to the TownBoard of the Town of Greece, Monroe County, New York (respectively, the "Town Board" and the "Town") for relief from mitigation measures that were established in 1992 pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617 et seq., the "SEQRA Regulations") (collectively, "SEQRA"), for property generally located north of English Road in the vicinity of Flynn Road and North Avenue (the "Proposal"); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. On May 5, 1992, the Town Board approved the Applicant's request to rezone property (the "1992 Rezoning Approval") in relation to part of a residential development (the "Georgetown Project") generally located north of English Road in the vicinity of Flynn Road and North Avenue.
2. Upon review of the Georgetown Project, the Town Board determined that the Georgetown Project was subject to SEQRA, and that development of the Georgetown Project constituted a Type I action under SEQRA.
3. Pursuant to the procedures established in SEQRA, the Town Board became the Lead Agency for the coordinated environmental review of the Georgetown Project.
4. In the coordinated environmental review of the Georgetown Project, the Town Board met the procedural and substantive requirements of SEQRA.
5. The Town Board, as the lead agency for the coordinated environmental review of the Georgetown Project, fully considered the alternatives, impacts, and mitigation measures that were identified in the Draft and Final Environmental Impact Statements (the "EISs") that were prepared when the Applicant requested the rezoning associated with the Georgetown Project.
6. On May 5, 1992, in accordance with SEQRA, the Town Board issued a Findings Statement (the "1992 SEQRA Findings Statement") before approving the aforementioned rezoning request. In the 1992 SEQRA Findings Statement, the Town Board concluded that, consistent with social, economic and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives available, the Georgetown Project would avoid or minimize adverse environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable, and that adverse environmental impacts would be avoided or minimized to the maximum extent practicable by incorporating as conditions to the decision those mitigative measures that were identified as practicable.
7. In the 1992 SEQRA Findings Statement, Appendix C, Mitigation Measures 1-3 addressed the future extension of Flynn Road (a two-lane Town street) southward through the Georgetown Project to English Road (Monroe County Route 109, a two-lane highway) at its the intersection with North Avenue (Monroe County Route 146, a two-lane highway) (the "Flynn Road Extension").
8. The Applicant did not offer and agree to, nor was required to, construct the Flynn Road Extension. However, the Applicant offered and agreed to undertake the three mitigation measures, which were intended to assist and partly facilitate such construction if it were to be undertaken by the Town or by the County of Monroe at some time in the future.
9. The Applicant has fulfilled Mitigation Measure 1, which was to convey to the Town sufficient land for an 80-foot-wide right-of-way in which the Flynn Road Extension

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could be constructed if such construction were to be undertaken by the Town or by the County of Monroe at some time in the future.

10. As of this date, neither the Town nor the County of Monroe has undertaken the Flynn Road Extension.
11. The Applicant still has the responsibility for Mitigation Measure 2, which is to install and pay for the fill and culvert that would be necessary for the Flynn Road Extension to cross Larkin Creek, which flows through the Georgetown Project.
12. The Applicant still has the responsibility for Mitigation Measure 3, which is to install and pay for a walkway across Larkin Creek, in the same area as the Flynn Road Extension and the aforementioned fill and culvert.
13. Because the Applicant could not fulfill Mitigation Measures 2 and 3 when the Georgetown Project was being developed, the Town Board required the Applicant to provide financial guarantees in the form of a letter of credit to cover the cost of these two Mitigation Measures (a total of \$95,000 at the time that said financial guarantees first were required).
14. The Applicant has submitted to the Town Board a request to be relieved of the responsibility for Mitigation Measures 2 and 3 in Appendix C of the 1992 SEQRA Findings Statement, and has requested release of the aforementioned letter of credit.
15. The Applicant has submitted a Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (a "DSEIS") relative to the Applicant's request, which included but was not limited to a written description of the request, various technical reports, various traffic analyses and addenda (collectively, the "Traffic Analysis"), and maps of the area surrounding the Georgetown Project.
16. SEQRA requires coordinated environmental review for all Type I actions that involve more than one involved agency, and a lead agency must be re-established prior to a determination of significance.
17. On January 19, 2010, the Town Board adopted a resolution declaring its intent to act as lead agency for the Proposal, and on March 3, 2010, the Town's Director of Development Services distributed the DSEIS and a copy of the application to all involved agencies, notifying them that a lead agency must be agreed upon within 30 calendar days and expressing the Town Board's intent to resume its role as lead agency for the Proposal.
18. Following the passage of 30 calendar days without objections from involved agencies, the Town Board resumed Lead Agency status for the coordinated environmental review of the Proposal and for the purpose of compliance with SEQRA, as codified in the SEQRA Regulations
19. In order to make a determination of significance pursuant to SEQRA, the Town Board carefully has considered information, recommendations, and comments that resulted from telephone conversations, meetings, or written correspondence from or with various involved and interested agencies, including but not limited to: the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation; the New York State Department of Transportation (the "NYSDOT"); the Monroe County Department of Transportation (the "MCDOT"); the Monroe County Department of Environmental Services, Division of Pure Waters; the Monroe County Water Authority; and the Town's own staff.
20. A federal wetland exists along and in the vicinity of Larkin Creek in the Georgetown Project, where the Flynn Road Extension would be located.
21. The United States Army Corps of Engineers (the "USACE") oversees the regulation and protection of federal wetlands.
22. At the time of the 1992 Rezoning Approval, the USACE wetland regulations had the effect of permitting up to 1.0 acre of wetland to be filled without significant limitations or mitigation by replacement of filled wetland.

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23. In 1996, the USACE adopted revised wetland regulations, with the resultant effect of permitting up to 0.33 acre of wetland to be filled without significant limitations or mitigation by replacement of filled wetland.
24. In 2002, the USACE adopted the revised wetland regulations that currently are in force and effect, which have the effect of permitting up to 0.1 acre of federal wetland (87 feet x 50 feet; 4350 square feet) to be filled without significant limitations or mitigation by replacement of filled wetland.
25. More than 0.1 acre of federal wetland would have to be filled in order to construct the Flynn Road Extension.
26. Previous experience in other locations in the Town of Greece indicates that the USACE would not permit the filling of more than 0.1 acre of wetland. The USACE has maintained this position even when the purpose of the fill was to facilitate the connection of two ends of a street and the connection of two housing developments (the Forest Glen and Forest Glen North subdivisions); these circumstances are substantially similar to those in the Georgetown Project and the Flynn Road Extension.
27. The MCDOT and the NYSDOT have reviewed the DSEIS, in particular, the Traffic Analysis and additional traffic information that was requested by the MCDOT.
28. The Traffic Analysis examined vehicular volumes, speeds, turning movements, cut-through traffic, and effects on the road networks in the neighborhood and the surrounding area, both in the present and the projected future.
29. The NYSDOT concluded that the lack of a Flynn Road Extension would not have an adverse impact on state highways and intersections.
30. The MCDOT concluded that the lack of a Flynn Road Extension will not have an adverse impact on the local highway network.
31. Granting relief from the mitigation measures will not prohibit the construction of the Flynn Road Extension in the future, if a need for such extension were to be demonstrated and if regulatory authorities were to permit it.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, pursuant to SEQRA, the Town Board determines that granting relief from Mitigation Measures 2 and 3 for the 1992 Rezoning Approval will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment, and be it further

RESOLVED that the Applicant no longer is, nor shall be, required to comply with Mitigation Measures 2 and 3 in the 1992 SEQRA Findings Statement, Appendix C, for the May 5, 1992, Town Board rezoning approval for the Georgetown Subdivision and Apartments, on property generally located north of English Road in the vicinity of Flynn Road and North Avenue.
