PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Supervisor Reilich called upon Councilman Mike Barry to lead the Town Board in the Pledge of Allegiance. Ms. Holly Ziegler of the Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of Greece provided the invocation.

Supervisor Reilich then provided his monthly update on significant Town projects and programs for the residents of the Town of Greece as follows:

TOWN BUDGET

On behalf of the entire Town Board I want to thank our Director of Finance Jon Hellman and John Natale for their fine work on preparing our budget documentation and presentation material. We worked closely with all of our department heads in put forth a budget that is fiscally sound for our residents.

We are of course pleased to report that the budget that will be put up for a vote this evening realizes a 6 cent decrease in the Town tax rate once again this year.

We have been able to bring new amenities to our residents, expand services and pay down overall debt while decreasing the rate.

GRANTS

What doesn't get mentioned enough is the amount of grants that we have been utilizing to assist in funding many of our services and amenities? These monies, if not granted to the Town of Greece would have been allocated somewhere and we of course would like to bring and keep our tax dollars local from other levels of Government. Since I first took office in January 2014 until today – the town has received over \$29M in grant funding that has been awarded for projects throughout the town. A partial list of grants received include Community Development Block grants that are used to fund our CDBG program. The new spit at Braddock Bay, Money for town hall campus amenities like the pickle ball courts and pavilion and most recently our awarding of over \$12M from the REDI program, the highest amount awarded to any municipality.

LIBRARY PETITION

We were pleased to support our Greece Public Library and libraries throughout the Monroe County Library System in offering and support a petition boycotting Macmillan Publishers in their new 3Book policy that would limit access to eBooks to our patrons. Information is available on my Facebook page and a printed version of the form is available at both of our library branches.

HOLIDAY SPIRIT

We are pleased to support many opportunities for residents to help their neighbors who are in need this holiday season. Right now in the Atrium we are asking for donations of new or gently used outerwear for children – being collected by Matts Coats for Kids – we are also for the first time hosting the Pirate Treasure Chest – on behalf of Gary the Happy Pirate and soon our annual giving tree will be put up where we will be accepting donations of socks, mittens and hats for local children in need. Please, if you are able, think about helping out others in our community this holiday season of giving.

PROCLAMATIONS, ADDITIONS/DELETIONS TO AGENDA

Supervisor Reilich along with the Town Board awarded three proclamations. The first was to Bryce Marine Dealership as the recipients of the prestigious Sea-Doo National Dealer of the Year Award held at the annual awards ceremony in Las Vegas, Nevada.

The second proclamation was awarded to Eagle Scout Tyler Stevenson for his achievement of reaching the rank of Eagle Scout in Troop #197. Tyler chose to clear, trim, edge and weed the Greece Athena School Courtyard for his project and also repaired the benches that were in disrepair.

Lastly, Reverend Charles Roberts, pastor of John Knox Presbyterian Church received a proclamation on his contributions to the Town of Greece Mediation Board, as President of the Greece Ministerial Association, his participation in the many days of Prayer Service for the Greece Assembly of God church and his (29) years as current pastor for John Knox Church. The Town Board wished him well in his future endeavors.

Law enforcement agencies across New York State have expressed public safety concerns regarding these reforms. The Town Board voices its strong opposition to this legislation.

1. In summary, the Applicant proposes to operate a restaurant in existing tenant space, including preparation, service, sale and consumption of food and drink, including alcoholic beverages, on the Premises.
2. A similar restaurant operated in the same tenant space previously.
3. The Applicant has requested that the Town Board waive the 30-day notification and comment period on an application to the New York State Liquor Authority for a liquor license.

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that the Town Board has no objection to the Applicant's request for an on-premises liquor license and hereby waives the 30-day notification and comment period for such application;

AND BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, pursuant to the authority conferred by New York State Town Law, Article 16, and pursuant to the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 211 (the "Zoning Ordinance"), the request submitted by TCFL, LLC for a waiver of the requirement to obtain a special use permit to operate a restaurant known as Russell Station Bar a& Grill, on property located at 4660 Dewey Avenue is hereby approved and granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Applicant shall operate the restaurant in conformity with all details of the Proposal, as described in the written descriptions and various plans of the Proposal, and as set forth herein. In the event of any conflict among the written descriptions of the Proposal, the various plans of the Proposal, or the requirements or restrictions of this resolution, the Town Board, in its sole discretion and judgment and without hearing, shall determine the resolution of such conflict.
2. The maximum occupancy in this restaurant shall be the limits established by the Town's Fire Marshal pursuant to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code.
3. The Applicant shall obtain all other approvals, permits, and certificates which may be required from the Town of Greece and any other agencies.
4. Failure to comply with all applicable federal, state, county, and Town laws, ordinances, codes, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code, may be grounds for revocation of this waiver.
5. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific public official, agency, or regulation it shall be construed to include any succeeding authority.

3. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific public official, agency, or regulation it shall be construed to include any succeeding authority.
