

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Town Board, Town of Greece, Monroe County held March 20, 2018 at the Town Hall, One Vince Tofany Boulevard, Rochester, New York at 6:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Supervisor Reilich called upon Councilman Josh Jensen to lead the Town Board in the Pledge of Allegiance. Pastor Steve Matson of Journey Christian Church provided the invocation.

Supervisor Reilich stated that he had many items to update the residents again this month on various Town projects and programs. He further stated that he received positive feedback about this new segment of the Town Board Meeting that will serve to provide some updates and insight for the public. The following is the Supervisor's transcript on these particular projects and programs for the Town of Greece residents information:

PARKS & REC

Our Parks Department has been very busy this winter working on improvements and repairs to our various facilities. One major project that we have been working on since last summer is the improvements and renovations of Adeline Lodge. We have installed a new floor – new restroom fixtures – newly painted walls – new windows – added a small kitchen with a refrigerator, microwave and sink and we will continue work on the outside of the structure as well.

This is one of our most popular lodges due to its modest rental price – and despite all of the improvements, we will keep the price as it has been so our residents have an affordable option.

Many of you may have seen my facebook post regarding the busy beavers in Badgerow Park – thanks to our Parks crew and some watchful trail users, we have identified the affected areas and are currently utilizing a trap and release method to lessen the beaver presence in the park. Much damage has been done by the beavers and if you ever doubted just how much strength they have – trust me they have been able to down several trees and then drag them to build a dam which was causing the creek to flood a good portion of our trail system. Work continues to get the area ready for our avid hikers late Spring, early summer.

SAFETY

At the suggestion of a resident, I worked with our DPW crews and IT departments to put up a "Safe Internet Exchange Zone". This area is monitored by cameras and is located in our parking lot just in front of the Court Building – this allows safe exchange of merchandise for sale and exchange to help our residents avoid having to have an interested buyer go to their home.

We have received an overwhelming amount of support for this and I am personally very happy that a resident reached out to me to share their idea.

Another safety related measure was also put into place at the suggestion of a resident – she asked if we could help with clear identification and location of our playing fields in the event of an emergency. As many of you are aware we have several premier fields throughout our parks system. We often have teams and individuals traveling to our area for competitive matches with a variety of sports. Critical time can be lost if there is an emergency at one of our fields, involving not just a child but perhaps an adult that has accompanied the child. We started in Badgerow Park South installing signs that indicate in the event of an emergency call 911 and then we provide the field number and the street address so that the individual making the call can give a clear and accurate description of their location. We hope to have this project completed before the opening season of Spring sports here in the Town of Greece. Again, another great suggestion that we were able to implement on behalf of all of our residents.

HYBRID VEHICLES

Many thanks to Assemblyman Peter Lawrence for a grant we will be receiving to purchase new vehicles for our special police – We have made a decision to purchase Hybrid vehicles and will monitor their potential benefits, such as gas costs and maintenance in comparison to the rest of our fleet vehicles – this is another

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instance of the Town of Greece embracing clean and energy efficiency alternatives and incorporating them into our practices.

LED LIGHTING

We made a decision to convert our conventional lighting throughout all of our Town Hall Campus buildings and parking lots in order to save energy and of course the associated expenses. I am happy to report that our Finance Director shared with me that our most recent bill is now showing those savings. Our employees have also shared that the lights are very conducive to their work because the lights while brighter are not as harsh and they are consistent throughout the building. This is a win-win for our employees and our residents. And we consistently look for new ways to operate as efficiently as possible.

GRANTS

I wanted to share that since I first took office that the Town of Greece has been very aggressive in seeking out outside funding for various projects, enhancements and amenities for our residents. To Date we have secured over\$3M in grant funding – this goes a long way in helping to keep our tax rate down while bringing new and exciting amenities to our taxpayers. Our 2018 Tax Rate is less than when I first took office.

PROCLAMATIONS, ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS TO AGENDA:

There were two proclamations awarded by the Town Board. The first was awarded to Eagle Scout recipient, Tristan Wend for his restoration project of the American Legion Post facility on Dorsey Road. The second proclamation went to Tyler Nersinger for renovations of sections of the pier at Braddock Bay Park.

PUBLIC FORUM:

An Open Forum was conducted to allow speakers the opportunity to address the Town Board. One speaker addressed the Town Board and the Open Forum concluded at 6:22 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

6:15 p.m. — Public hearing to consider the request submitted by Hi-Style Development Corporation to rezone 10.86± acres from R1-18 (Single-Family Residential) to R1-8 (Single-Family Residential), on property located at approximately 849 Flynn Road (generally west of Flynn Road and north of the Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation utility right-of-way).

Supervisor Reilich declared the public hearing open at 6:22 p.m. to consider the request submitted by Hi-Style Development Corporation to rezone 10.86± acres from R1-18 (Single-Family Residential) to R1-8 (Single-Family Residential), on property located at approximately 849 Flynn Road (generally west of Flynn Road and north of the Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation utility right-of-way). Proof of publication in the Greece Post on Thursday, March 8, 2018 was read and received. Representatives from Hi-Style Development Corporation provided an overview of the project. There were fifteen speakers and the hearing concluded at 8:21 p.m.

#90 - Councilman Barry offered the following resolution and moved its adoption; seconded by Councilwoman Christodaro:

WHEREAS, Hi-Style Development Corporation (the “Applicant”) has submitted a request to the Town Board (the “Town Board”) of the Town of Greece (the “Town”), Monroe County, New York, to amend the Official Zoning Map (“the Official Zoning Map”) of the Town of Greece, New York, relative to property located at approximately 849 Flynn Road (generally west of Flynn Road and north of the Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation’s utility right-of-way); and

WHEREAS, having carefully considered all relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence submitted, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. In summary, the Applicant’s proposal (the “Proposal”) is to rezone 10.86± acres of real property (the Premises”) from R1-18 (Single-Family Residential) to R1-8 (Single-Family Residential). The Applicant proposes to construct single-family detached houses for sale, with related paved roadway and driveways, utilities, grading, lawns/landscaping/buffering, and other site modifications (the “Project”). The proposed vehicular access for the Premises is via an unsignalized street intersection at Flynn Road (Monroe County Route 142, a two-lane local collector). The Premises currently consist of undeveloped land covered by brush and succession-growth trees that followed the Premises having been an open field, possibly used for agriculture in the past; a tributary stream of Buck Pond crosses the eastern part

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of the Premises. Existing land uses in the vicinity include but are not limited to single-family houses and undeveloped land.

2. Proof was had of the notice of a public hearing on a resolution proposing to amend said Official Zoning Map by rezoning 10.86± acres from R1-18 (Single-Family Residential) to R1-8 (Single-Family Residential), relative to property located at 849± Flynn Road.
3. On March 20, 2018 at 6:15 p.m. in the Greece Town Hall, 1 Vince Tofany Boulevard, the Town Board held a public hearing (the "Hearing") to consider the Proposal, at which time all parties in interest and citizens were afforded an opportunity to be heard.
4. Documentary, testimonial, and other evidence relative to the Proposal was presented at the Hearing for the Town Board's consideration.
5. At the conclusion of the Hearing, the Town Board closed the Hearing.
6. The Premises are surrounded by the following zoning districts and land uses:

North: R1-E (Single-Family Residential)—single-family houses.

South: R1-E (Single-Family Residential)—Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation utility right-of-way (70± feet wide) and single-family houses.

East: R1-E (Single-Family Residential)—single-family houses.

Southeast: R1-18 (Single-Family Residential)—undeveloped land.

West: R1-E (Single-Family Residential)—undeveloped land; R1-18 (Single-Family Residential)—undeveloped land and a telecommunications facility (cellular telephone antenna tower and accessory antenna structures; R1-12 (Single-Family Residential)—undeveloped land.
7. On February 15, 2017, the Town Board denied a similar request by the Applicant to amend the Official Zoning Map relative to the Property.
8. On February 15, 2017, in accordance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617, the "SEQRA Regulations") (collectively, "SEQRA"), the Town Board issued a Negative Declaration for the Proposal and the Project (the "2017 SEQRA Negative Declaration"). The 2017 SEQRA Negative Declaration is incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth, as findings of the Town Board in its decision on the Proposal and the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, pursuant to the authority conferred by New York State Town Law, Article 16, and the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 211 (Zoning) (the "Zoning Ordinance"), the request to amend the Official Zoning Map of the Town of Greece, New York, by changing the zoning classification of 10.86± acres from R1-18 (Single-Family Residential) to R1-8 (Single-Family Residential), relative to property located at approximately 849 Flynn Road (generally west of Flynn Road and north of the Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation's utility right-of-way), as more particularly identified in the description attached hereto, hereby be and the same is denied.

WHEREAS, Valerie Nix (the "Applicant/Project Sponsor") has submitted a request to the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Greece (the "Town"), Monroe County, New York, for a special use permit to expand an existing daycare center and school-age child-care center, known as Rising Stars Daycare, on property located at 3450 West Ridge Road, in an R1-12 (Single-Family Residential) Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, having considered carefully all relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence submitted, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. In summary, the Applicant/Project Sponsor's proposal (the "Proposal") is to expand an existing child daycare center and school-age child-care center in existing space in a place of worship (the "Premises"), in order to accommodate 25 additional children. The Proposal includes daycare and before- and after-school care (and child care during school breaks) for children between the ages of 6 weeks and 12 years. One or more areas are provided for children to play outdoors under supervision. Occasionally, there will be special events on the Premises, such as open houses, graduation ceremonies, and holiday parties. The Applicant/Project Sponsor's sponsorship of, affiliation with, permission for, or participation in one-time or recurring special or promotional events on the Premises will be subject to the applicable requirements and restrictions of the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 175 (Special Events). The proposed hours of availability to clients are: Mondays through Fridays, 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Vehicular access for the Premises is via unsignalized driveways at West Ridge Road (New York State Route 104, a seven-lane urban principal arterial street) and North Avenue (Monroe County Route 146, a two-lane urban collector); North Avenue has a signalized intersection with West Ridge Road.
2. Upon review of the Proposal, the Town Board determined that the Proposal is subject to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617, the "SEQRA Regulations") (collectively, "SEQRA"), and that the Proposal constitutes a Type II action under SEQRA. (SEQRA Regulations, § 617.5(c)(1) & (2).)
3. According to SEQRA, Type II actions have been determined to not have a significant impact on the environment and are not subject to further review under SEQRA.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, SEQRA does not require further action by the Town Board relative to the Proposal.

WHEREAS, having considered carefully all relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence submitted, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. In summary, the Applicant's proposal (the "Proposal") is to expand an existing child daycare center and school-age child-care center in existing space in a place of worship (the "Premises"), in order to accommodate 25 additional children. The Proposal includes daycare and before- and after-school care (and child care during school breaks) for children between the ages of 6 weeks and 12 years. One or more areas are provided for children to play outdoors under supervision. Occasionally, there will be special events on the Premises, such as open houses, graduation ceremonies, and holiday parties. The Applicant's sponsorship of, affiliation with, permission for, or participation in one-time or recurring special or promotional events on the Premises will be subject to the applicable requirements and restrictions of the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 175 (Special Events). The proposed hours of availability to clients are: Mondays through Fridays, 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Vehicular access for the Premises is via unsignalized driveways at West Ridge Road (New York State Route 104,

a seven-lane urban principal arterial street) and North Avenue (Monroe County Route 146, a two-lane urban collector); North Avenue has a signalized intersection with West Ridge Road.

2. Proof was had of the notice of public hearing on a resolution proposing to permit the Proposal.
3. On March 20, 2018 at 6:16 p.m. in the Greece Town Hall, 1 Vince Tofany Boulevard, the Town Board held a public hearing (the "Hearing") to consider the Proposal, at which time all parties in interest and citizens were afforded an opportunity to be heard.
4. Documentary, testimonial, and other evidence relative to the Proposal were presented at the Hearing for the Town Board's consideration.
5. At the conclusion of the Hearing, the Town Board closed the Hearing.
6. Based on the Town Board's review of relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence, the location, nature, duration, and intensity of the Proposal: (a) will not adversely affect the orderly pattern of development in the area; (b) will be in harmony with nearby uses; (c) will not alter the essential character of the nearby neighborhood, nor be detrimental to the residents thereof; (d) will not create a hazard to health, safety, or the general welfare; (e) will not be detrimental to the flow of traffic; and (f) will not place an excessive burden on public improvements, facilities, services, or utilities.
7. Public utility service and vehicular access are adequate for the Proposal.
8. The size and shape of the Premises are adequate for the Proposal.
9. Having considered the Proposal and all additional information that may be relevant to the Proposal, it is in the public interest to grant the requested special use permit.

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, testimony, documentation, and findings, pursuant to the authority conferred by New York State Town Law, Article 16, and pursuant to the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 211 (Zoning) (the "Zoning Ordinance"), the request submitted by Valerie Nix (the "Applicant") for a special use permit to expand an existing daycare center and school-age child-care center, known as Rising Stars Daycare, on property located at 3450 West Ridge Road, in an R1-12 (Single-Family Residential) Zoning District, hereby be and the same is approved and granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Applicant shall operate this day-care center and school-age child-care center in conformity with all details of the Proposal, as presented in the written descriptions and various maps, plans and illustrations of the Proposal, as orally described at the Hearing, and as set forth herein. In the event of any conflict among the oral or written descriptions of the Proposal, the various maps, plans and illustrations of the Proposal, or the requirements or restrictions of this resolution, the Town Board, in its sole discretion and judgment and without hearing, shall determine the resolution of such conflict.
2. The maximum occupancies in this day-care center and school-age child-care center shall be the limits established by the Town's Fire Marshal pursuant to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code.
3. The Applicant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, county, and Town laws, ordinances, codes, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code and all applicable requirements for the installation/maintenance of a grease trap. Failure to comply with such requirements may be grounds for revocation of this special use permit.
4. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific applicant, developer, or operator, it shall be construed to include successors and assigns.
5. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific public official or agency, it shall be construed to include designees, successors, and assigns.
6. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific law, ordinance, code, rule, or regulation, it shall be construed to include any succeeding or superseding authority.
7. Upon the sale or other transfer of controlling interest in this day-care center and school-age child-care center to any person or entity other than Valerie Nix, her wholly owned subsidiaries, or her franchisees, a new application for a special use permit must be submitted to the Town Board.
