

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Town Board, Town of Greece, Monroe County held April 17, 2018 at the Town Hall, One Vince Tofany Boulevard, Rochester, New York at 6:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Supervisor Reilich called upon Councilwoman Diana Christodaro to lead the Town Board in the Pledge of Allegiance. Secretary Holly Ziegler of the Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of Greece provided the invocation.

Supervisor Reilich stated that he had several items to update the residents again this month on various Town projects and programs. The following is the Supervisor's transcript on these particular projects and programs for the Town of Greece residents' information:

WINDSTORM

Supervisor Reilich stated that the Town was well prepared to handle the increase in winds that occurred. The outages that struck did not require opening up the Community Center to house folks overnight. The Supervisor was extremely pleased in how the Town's staff handled the wind severity as everyone worked very hard to ensure the residents safety.

FLOODING

Supervisor Reilich commented that the Aqua Dam had deflated on the western end; however, the State worked to repair it on Sunday and ensured that it was working properly. He also stated that a total of (11) shut-off valves were installed in various locations that were identified as critical and they were working properly. There were a total of (9) liberty pumps that were also working along old Edgemere Drive. Supervisor Reilich stated that he sent the IJC a letter calling on the board to maintain or increase Lake Ontario outflows to alleviate the potential for additional flooding.

COMMUNITY & SENIOR CENTER

More than 300 children participated in programs and activities that were offered by the Parks and Recreation staff during spring break week. The classes offered included first-aid, pickle ball and painting and were very well attended and well received.

GREECE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Supervisor Reilich stated that proclamations were awarded during a ceremony honoring the Greece Police personnel. Proclamations were awarded for achievements as, "Officer of the Month" and "Officer of the Year". These recognitions were provided to the outstanding officers who excelled in their line of duty.

Additionally, the Supervisor stated that in response to the current opioid crisis, all 100 Greece Police Officers as well as Town Hall staff have been trained in administering of Narcan in an overdose situation.

PROCLAMATIONS, ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS TO AGENDA:

There were four proclamations awarded by the Town Board. The first was awarded to Eagle Scout recipient, Dylan Contestabile for his revitalization project of a trail at Badgerow Park. The second proclamation was awarded to Jack Bebout for his participation in a project entitled, "A Horse's Friend", which is a non-profit organization that helps inner-city youth and at-risk youth. The third proclamation was awarded to Raymond Sykes for his installation of wood duck nesting boxes around the ponds in the Town for the Lake Plains Waterfowl Association. Lastly, the fourth proclamation was awarded to Samuel Maloney for building 4 wheelchair accessible garden beds for Homesteads for Hope.

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PUBLIC FORUM:

An Open Forum was conducted to allow speakers the opportunity to address the Town Board. Four speakers addressed the Town Board and the Open Forum concluded at 6:38 p.m.

WHEREAS, Sisu Eats LLC (the "Applicant/Project Sponsor") has submitted a request to the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Greece (the "Town"), Monroe County, New York, for a waiver of the requirements for a new special use permit to operate a restaurant, formerly known as Mighty Taco, now to be known as Sisu Eats, on property located at 2570 Ridgeway Avenue, in Erie Canal Commons plaza, in a BR (Restricted Business) Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, having considered carefully all relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence submitted, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. In summary, the Applicant/Project Sponsor's proposal (the "Proposal") is to operate a restaurant in a freestanding building at an existing commercial plaza (the "Premises"). The Proposal includes preparation, service, and sale of hot and cold foods (for example, salads and soups) for consumption on the Premises and for takeout and delivery (including a drive-up service window), and alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages for consumption at the restaurant. Weather permitting, outdoor seating for consumption of food and beverages will be provided in a limited area that is adjacent to the restaurant. The Proposal does not include outdoor loudspeakers or outdoor cooking. Background music and live entertainment (as these terms are defined in the Town's zoning ordinance) will not be provided on a regular, recurring basis. Background music, live entertainment, and the Applicant/Project Sponsor's sponsorship of, affiliation with, permission for, or participation in one-time or recurring special or promotional events on the Premises will be subject to the requirements and restrictions of the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 175 (Special Events). The proposed hours of availability to the public for dining and takeout service inside the restaurant, takeout service at the drive-up service window, and delivery service are: Sundays through Saturdays, 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight. Vehicular access for the Premises is via a signalized driveway at Ridgeway Avenue (Monroe County Route 111, a two-lane urban minor arterial), and an unsignalized driveway at Long Pond Road (Monroe County Route 136, a four-lane urban minor arterial).
2. According to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617, the "SEQRA Regulations") (collectively, "SEQRA"), the Proposal is classified as a Type II action (See § 617.5(c)(1), (2) & (26) of the SEQRA Regulations).
3. According to SEQRA, Type II actions have been determined to not have a significant impact on the environment and are not subject to further review under SEQRA.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, SEQRA does not require further action relative to the Proposal.

Weather permitting, outdoor seating for consumption of food and beverages will be provided in a limited area that is adjacent to the restaurant. The Proposal does not include outdoor loudspeakers or outdoor cooking. Background music and live entertainment (as these terms are defined in the Town's zoning ordinance) will not be provided on a regular, recurring basis. Background music, live entertainment, and the Applicant's sponsorship of, affiliation with, permission for, or participation in one-time or recurring special or promotional events on the Premises will be subject to the requirements and restrictions of the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 175 (Special Events). The proposed hours of availability to the public for dining and takeout service inside the restaurant, takeout service at the drive-up service window, and delivery service are: Sundays through Saturdays, 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight. Vehicular access for the Premises is via a signalized driveway at Ridgeway Avenue (Monroe County Route 111, a two-lane urban minor arterial), and an unsignalized driveway at Long Pond Road (Monroe County Route 136, a four-lane urban minor arterial).

2. The Proposal is in substantial conformity with the previous operator's description of the nature, duration, and intensity of the operation.
3. Based on the Town Board's review of relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence, the location, nature, duration, and intensity of the previous restaurant operation: (a) did not adversely affect the orderly pattern of development in the area; (b) was in harmony with nearby uses; (c) did not alter the essential character of the nearby neighborhood, nor was it detrimental to the residents thereof; (d) did not create a hazard to health, safety, or the general welfare; (e) was not detrimental to the flow of traffic; and (f) did not place an excessive burden on public improvements, facilities, services, or utilities.
4. Public utility service and vehicular access are adequate for the Proposal.
5. The size and shape of the Premises are adequate for the Proposal.
6. Having considered the Proposal and all additional information that may be relevant to the Proposal, it is in the public interest to grant the requested waiver of the requirements to obtain a new special use permit.

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that the Town Board has no objection to the Applicant's application for an on-premises liquor license at the Premises and hereby waives the 30-day notification and comment period for such application;

AND BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, pursuant to the authority conferred by New York State Town Law, Article 16, and pursuant to the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 211 (Zoning) (the "Zoning Ordinance"), the request submitted by Sisu Eats LLC (the "Applicant") for a waiver of the requirements for a new special use permit to operate a restaurant, formerly known as Mighty Taco, now to be known as Sisu Eats, on property located at 2570 Ridgeway Avenue, in Erie Canal Commons plaza, in a BR (Restricted Business) Zoning District, hereby be and the same is approved and granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Applicant shall operate this restaurant in conformity with all details of the Proposal, as described in the written descriptions and various plans of the Proposal, and as set forth herein. In the event of any conflict among the written descriptions of the Proposal, the various plans of the Proposal, or the requirements or restrictions of this resolution, the Town Board, in its sole discretion and judgment and without hearing, shall determine the resolution of such conflict.
2. The maximum occupancies in this restaurant shall be the limits established by the Town's Fire Marshal pursuant to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code.

The Applicant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, county, and Town laws, ordinances, codes, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code and all applicable requirements for the installation/maintenance of a grease trap. Failure to comply with such requirements may be grounds for revocation of this special use permit.

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4. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific applicant, developer, or operator, it shall be construed to include successors and assigns.
5. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific public official or agency, it shall be construed to include agents, designees, and successors.
6. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific law, ordinance, code, rule, or regulation, it shall be construed to include any superseding or succeeding authority.
7. Upon the sale or other transfer of controlling interest in this restaurant to any person or entity other than Sisu Eats LLC, its wholly owned subsidiaries, or its franchisees, a new application for a special use permit must be submitted to the Town Board.

Background music, live entertainment, and the Applicant/Project Sponsor's sponsorship of, affiliation with, permission for, or participation in one-time or recurring special or promotional events on the Premises will be subject to the requirements and restrictions of the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 175 (Special Events). The Proposal does not include delivery service or a drive-up service window. The proposed hours of availability to the public are: Mondays through Fridays, 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m.; and Saturdays and Sundays, 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. The docks that are on the Premises, on Salmon Creek, primarily are for short-term usage by boaters that are visiting the restaurant; however, some of the docks may be rented for longer-term dockage during the boating season. Vehicular access for the Premises is via an unsignalized driveway at Manitou Road (New York State Route 261, a two-lane urban minor arterial).
2. WHEREAS, Jeremiah's Greece, Inc. (the "Applicant") has submitted a request to the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Greece (the "Town"), Monroe County, New York, for a special use permit to operate a restaurant, to be known as Jeremiah's Tavern (the "Proposal"), on property located at 751 Long Pond Road, in Wegmans Plaza at 3177 Latta Road (the "Premises"), in a BG (General Business) Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has established a public hearing (the "Public Hearing") to consider the Proposal, to be held on Tuesday, May 15, 2018 at 6:15 p.m. in the Greece Town Hall, 1 Vince Tofany Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 211 (Zoning) (the "Zoning Ordinance"), at the request of an applicant or on its own initiative, the Town Board may waive or modify the notification requirements for a special use permit if, in the Town Board's opinion, it is warranted by the circumstances (Zoning Ordinance, Section 61(B)(1)(e)); and

WHEREAS, the Proposal is for a restaurant in part of an existing freestanding building that previously was used as a child daycare center; and

WHEREAS, the Premises are a commercial development which consists of almost 76 acres; and

WHEREAS, the Proposal is located on 5.7± acres of the Premises;

WHEREAS, the zoning and/or use of some properties within 500 feet of the entire commercial development is nonresidential; and

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WHEREAS, sending notice of the Public Hearing to the owners of all properties within 500 feet of the entire commercial development would greatly exceed the intent of the notification requirement in the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, sending notice of the Public Hearing to the owners of residences near the Premises would meet the intent of the notification requirement in the Zoning Ordinance.

ESTABLISHING ENERGY BENCHMARKING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, buildings are the single largest user of energy in the State of New York. The poorest performing buildings typically use several times the energy of the highest performing buildings—for the exact same building use; and

WHEREAS, collecting, reporting, and sharing building energy data on a regular basis allows municipal officials and the public to understand the energy performance of municipal buildings relative to similar buildings nationwide, and equipped with this information the Town of Greece is able to make smarter, more cost-effective operational and capital investment decisions, reward efficiency, and drive widespread, continuous improvement; and

WHEREAS, the Greece Town Board desires to use Building Energy Benchmarking - a process of measuring a building's energy use, tracking that use over time, and comparing performance to similar buildings - to promote the public health, safety, and welfare by making available good, actionable information on municipal building energy use to help identify opportunities to cut costs and reduce pollution in the Town of Greece and

WHEREAS, the Greece Town Board desires to establish procedure or guideline for town staff to conduct such Building Energy Benchmarking; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND DETERMINED, that the following specific policies and procedures are hereby adopted;

BUILDING ENERGY BENCHMARKING POLICY/PROCEDURES

§1. DEFINITIONS

(A) "Benchmarking Information" shall mean information generated by Portfolio Manager, as herein defined including descriptive information about the physical building and its operational characteristics.

(B) "Building Energy Benchmarking" shall mean the process of measuring a building's Energy use, tracking that use over time, and comparing performance to similar buildings.

(C) "Commissioner" shall mean the head of the Department.

(4) "Covered Municipal Building" shall mean a building or facility that is owned or occupied by the Town of Greece that is 1,000 square feet or larger in size.

(5) "Department" shall mean the Finance Department

(6) "Energy" shall mean electricity, natural gas, steam, hot or chilled water, fuel oil, or other product for use in a building, or renewable on-site electricity generation, for purposes of providing heating, cooling, lighting, water

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heating, or for powering or fueling other end-uses in the building and related facilities, as reflected in Utility bills or other documentation of actual Energy use.

(7) "Energy Performance Score" shall mean the numeric rating generated by Portfolio Manager that compares the Energy usage of the building to that of similar buildings.

(8) "Energy Use Intensity (EUI)" shall mean the kBtUs (1,000 British Thermal Units) used per square foot of gross floor area.

(9) "Gross Floor Area" shall mean the total number of enclosed square feet measured between the exterior surfaces of the fixed walls within any structure used or intended for supporting or sheltering any use or occupancy.

(11) "Portfolio Manager" shall mean ENERGY STAR Portfolio Manager, the internet-based tool developed and maintained by the United States Environmental Protection Agency to track and assess the relative Energy performance of buildings nationwide, or successor.

(12) "Utility" shall mean an entity that distributes and sells Energy to Covered Municipal Buildings.

(13) "Weather Normalized Site EUI" shall mean the amount of Energy that would have been used by a property under 30-year average temperatures, accounting for the difference between average temperatures and yearly fluctuations.

§2. APPLICABILITY

(1) This policy is applicable to all Covered Municipal Buildings as defined in Section 2 of this policy.

(2) The Commissioner may exempt a particular Covered Municipal Building from the benchmarking requirement if the Commissioner determines that it has characteristics that make benchmarking impractical.

§3. BENCHMARKING REQUIRED FOR COVERED MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS

(1) No later than May 1, 2017, and no later than May 1 every year thereafter, the Commissioner or his or her designee from the Department shall enter into Portfolio Manager the total Energy consumed by each Covered Municipal Building, along with all other descriptive information required by Portfolio Manager for the previous calendar year.

(2) For new Covered Municipal Buildings that have not accumulated 12 months of Energy use data by the first applicable date following occupancy for inputting Energy use into Portfolio Manager, the Commissioner or his or her designee from the Department shall begin inputting data in the following year.

§4. DISCLOSURE AND PUBLICATION OF BENCHMARKING INFORMATION

(1) The Department shall make available to the public on the internet Benchmarking Information for the previous calendar year:

(a) no later than September 1, 2017 and by September 1 of each year thereafter for Covered Municipal Buildings; and

(2) The Department shall make available to the public on the internet and update at least annually, the following Benchmarking Information:

(a) Summary statistics on Energy consumption for Covered Municipal Buildings derived from aggregation of Benchmarking Information; and

(b) For each Covered Municipal Building individually:

(i) The status of compliance with the requirements of this Policy; and

(ii) The building address, primary use type, and gross floor area; and

(iii) Annual summary statistics, including site EUI, Weather Normalized Source EUI, annual GHG emissions, and an Energy Performance Score where available; and

(iv) A comparison of the annual summary statistics (as required by Section 5(2)(b)(iii) of this Policy) across calendar years for all years since annual reporting under this Policy has been required for said building.

§5. MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS

The Department shall maintain records as necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Policy, including but not limited to Energy bills and other documents received from tenants and/or Utilities. Such records shall be preserved by the Department for a period of three (3) years.

§6. ENFORCEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

(1) The Commissioner or his or her designee from the Department shall be the Chief Enforcement Officer of this Policy.

(2) The Chief Enforcement Officer of this Policy may promulgate regulations necessary for the administration of the requirements of this Policy.

(3) Within thirty days after each anniversary date of the effective date of this Policy, the Chief Enforcement Officer shall submit a report to the Town Council including but not limited to summary statistics on Energy consumption for Covered Municipal Buildings derived from aggregation of Benchmarking Information, a list of all Covered Municipal Buildings identifying each Covered Municipal Building that the Commissioner determined to be exempt from the benchmarking requirement and the reason for the exemption, and the status of compliance with the requirements of this Policy.

§7. EFFECTIVE DATE

This policy shall be effective immediately upon passage.

§8. SEVERABILITY

The invalidity or unenforceability of any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or phrase of the aforementioned sections, as declared by the valid judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or phrase, which shall remain in full force and effect.
