**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

Supervisor Reilich called upon Councilman Mike Barry to lead the Town Board in the Pledge of Allegiance. The invocation was provided by Pastor Kirk Dueker of Hope Lutheran Church.

Supervisor Reilich stated that he had several items to update the residents again this month on various Town projects and programs. The following is the Supervisor's transcript on these particular projects and programs for the Town of Greece residents' information:

**GOOD OLD FASHIONED 4<sup>TH</sup> OF JULY CELEBRATION**

The Town Board and I are so happy that we were able to bring this fantastic celebration back to the Town of Greece. This year we celebrated 5 years of the best fireworks anywhere around.

Orleans was our featured performer – we opened year one with them and because of the amount of people reaching out and requesting them to return we brought them back on this, our 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Opening up for Orleans was hometown favorite Josie Waverly – she provides a great home town version of the best of the best in Country Music.

The 5K Run had record numbers this year – I'm certain next year we will cross the 200 participant mark and the kids superhero run tripled in size this year. We started our day at 6:00 am any many of us were around until well after midnight returning the campus to its pre-celebration condition.

All total there were over 15,000 families and neighbors that joined us for the fireworks. Once again, the shuttle buses worked out wonderful and we are told that thousands of people also enjoyed the fireworks in the surrounding neighborhoods.

Perhaps the most important thing to report is again this year the event went off without any incidences. I'd like to thank the Greece Town Board, my management team, so many of our employees that volunteered their time and our Greece Police and Special Police for their dedication and commitment to providing a safe and enjoyable time for our residents.

**GREENLIGHT**

For those who have contacted us, we wanted to share what we could about Greenlight coming to town. We met with representatives from Greenlight about 3 years ago – it was a start-up company with a great product. At that time they had neither the resources nor the manpower to take on the Town of Greece for service. We have kept in constant contact with them, however, and just today The Deputy Supervisor, our Public Works Commissioner and several engineers, our IT Director and I were on site for the Micro Trenching Demo that was taking place in Gates. We spent the good deal of the morning watching the process, talking with their engineers and their Vice President of Engineering. We are actively pursuing them to bring this option to our residents.

During our meeting they shared that when they do come to Greece, it will be their largest municipality to date and they have been gearing up for us since day one. I think competition is good in business, it keeps everyone in check and encourages all interested parties to provide the best and most reliable service. 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## **TC HOOLIGANS**

The Town Board and I were happy to host the ribbon cutting for TC Hooligans in their new location, which was the former site of Famous Dave's BBQ. This is another example of a vacant business location being "backfilled" by another vibrant business. They are family owned and this new location will allow them to accommodate more patrons.

## **PHOTONICS BUILDING UPDATE**

I wanted to provide some information on this to our residents. I personally was on site when the Governor and our former Congresswoman touted the great accomplishments of bringing Photonics to Greece. We wanted to be able to embrace the potential that Photonics could bring to our region, however, I admit I was skeptical of the plans as they were laid out. Originally we thought that this large facility would be active on the tax rolls, only to learn the Governor had partnered with SUNY and the facility would be exempt from taxes. Still, the prospect of bringing tech jobs to Greece was very attractive. I've followed their progress, or lack thereof – I've worked closely with our neighboring Supervisor Mark Assini and with new information I've learned recently, I've decided to reach out to the Governor and the SUNY Chancellor and ask them to release the building and put in on the market for sale. I've mailed them an official request from my office and I will keep our residents posted on the response.

The building is nearly empty – there are few employees, the clean room which was a large selling feature of the space has been dismantled and we see no progress whatsoever. Greece deserves the opportunity to have this space available for occupancy by someone who will help provide more jobs for our community.

Supervisor Reilich declared the public hearing open at 6:16 p.m. to consider the request submitted by Dark Matter Scream Works LLC for a special use permit to operate a commercial recreation facility on property located at 296 Greece Ridge Center Drive, in the Mall at Greece Ridge Center.

Proof of publication in the Greece Post on Thursday, July 5, 2018 was read and received. Representatives of Dark Matter Scream Works LLC provided an overview of the project. There were no speakers and the hearing concluded at 6:20 p.m.

#218A- Councilman Murphy offered the following resolution and moved its adoption; seconded by Councilman Jensen:

WHEREAS, Dark Matter Scream Works, LLC (the "Applicant/Project Sponsor") has submitted a request to the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Greece (the "Town"), Monroe County, New York for a special use permit to operate a commercial recreation facility, to be known as Dark Matter Scream Works, on property located at 296 Greece Ridge Center Drive, in The Mall at Greece Ridge, in a BG (General Business) Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, having considered carefully all relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence submitted, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. In summary, the Applicant/Project Sponsor's proposal (the "Proposal") is to operate a commercial recreation facility within existing tenant space located in a multiple-tenant commercial mall (the

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“Premises”). The Proposal includes live, interactive entertainment (principally, a “haunted house” in the weeks leading up to Halloween and for a short time thereafter, on every Friday the 13th, and during high school prom season in May and June), and decorative displays that coincide in time and theme with various holidays during the year. The Proposal also includes the sale of packaged snacks, candy, and soft drinks. The proposed hours of availability to the public are: Thursdays through Sundays, 7:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight, with occasional additional operations on Saturdays, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Vehicular access for the Premises is via signalized and unsignalized driveways at West Ridge Road (New York State Route 104, a seven-lane urban principal arterial street), Long Pond Road (Monroe County Route 136, a four-lane urban minor arterial), and Somerworth Drive (a two-lane Town subdivision street). Existing land uses in the vicinity include but are not limited to single-family houses; apartments; office, retail, restaurant, and service uses, including a commercial mall; a firehouse; a public park; a place of worship; a public elementary school; and undeveloped land.

2. Upon review of the Proposal, the Town Board determined that the Proposal is subject to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617, the “SEQRA Regulations”) (collectively, “SEQRA”), and that the Proposal constitutes a Type II action under SEQRA. (SEQRA Regulations, § 617.5(c)(1) & (2).)
3. According to SEQRA, Type II actions have been determined not to have a significant adverse impact on the environment and are not subject to further review under SEQRA.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, SEQRA does not require further action by the Town Board relative to the Proposal.

WHEREAS, Dark Matter Scream Works, LLC (the “Applicant”) has submitted a request to the Town Board (the “Town Board”) of the Town of Greece (the “Town”), Monroe County, New York for a special use permit to operate a commercial recreation facility, to be known as Dark Matter Scream Works, on property located at 296 Greece Ridge Center Drive, in The Mall at Greece Ridge, in a BG (General Business) Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. In summary, the Applicant’s proposal (the “Proposal”) is to operate a commercial recreation facility within existing tenant space located in a multiple-tenant commercial mall (the “Premises”). The Proposal includes live, interactive entertainment (principally, a “haunted house” in the weeks leading up to Halloween and for a short time thereafter, on every Friday the 13th, and during high school prom season in May and June), and decorative displays that coincide in time and theme with various holidays during the year. The Proposal also includes the sale of packaged snacks, candy, and soft drinks. 2. Proof was had of the notice of public hearing on a resolution proposing to permit the Proposal.
3. On July 17, 2018 at 6:15 p.m. in the Greece Town Hall, 1 Vince Tofany Boulevard, the Town Board held a public hearing (the “Hearing”) to consider the Proposal, at which time all parties in interest and citizens were afforded an opportunity to be heard.

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4. Documentary, testimonial, and other evidence relative to the Proposal was presented at the Hearing for the Town Board's consideration.
5. At the conclusion of the Hearing, the Town Board closed the Hearing and reserved decision on the Proposal, but continued to accept and consider written comments from all parties in interest, citizens, and agencies.
6. Based on the Town Board's review of relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence, the location, nature, duration, and intensity of the Proposal: (a) will not adversely affect the orderly pattern of development in the area; (b) will be in harmony with nearby uses; (c) will not alter the essential character of the nearby neighborhood, nor will it be detrimental to the residents thereof; (d) will not create a hazard to health, safety or the general welfare; (e) will not be detrimental to the flow of traffic; and (f) will not place an excessive burden on public improvements, facilities, services, or utilities.
7. Access to the Premises and the size and shape of the Premises are adequate for the Proposal.
8. Public utility service and vehicular access are adequate for the Proposal.
9. Having considered the Proposal and all additional information that may be relevant to the Proposal, it is in the public interest to grant the requested special use permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, documentation, testimony, and findings, pursuant to the authority conferred by New York State Town Law, Article 16, the request submitted by Dark Matter Scream Works, LLC (the "Applicant") for a special use permit to operate a commercial recreation facility, to be known as Dark Matter Scream Works, on property located at 296 Greece Ridge Center Drive, in The Mall at Greece Ridge, in a BG (General Business) Zoning District, hereby be and the same is approved and granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Applicant shall operate this commercial recreation facility in conformity with all details of the Proposal, as described in the written descriptions and various plans of the Proposal, and as set forth herein. In the event of any conflict among the written descriptions of the Proposal, the various plans of the Proposal, or the requirements or restrictions of this resolution, the Town Board, in its sole discretion and judgment and without hearing, shall determine the resolution of such conflict.
2. The maximum occupancies in this commercial recreation facility shall be the limits established by the Town's Fire Marshal pursuant to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code.
3. The Applicant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, county, and Town laws, ordinances, codes, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code and all applicable requirements for the installation/maintenance of a grease trap. Failure to comply with such requirements may be grounds for revocation of this special use permit.
4. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific applicant, developer, or operator, it shall be construed to include successors and assigns.
5. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific public official or agency, it shall be construed to include designees, successors, and assigns.
6. Wherever this resolution refers to a specific law, ordinance, code, rule, or regulation, it shall be construed to include any superseding or succeeding authority.
7. Upon the sale or other transfer of controlling interest in this commercial recreation facility to any person or entity other than Dark Matter Scream Works, LLC, its wholly owned subsidiaries, or its franchisees, a new application for a special use permit must be submitted to the Town Board.

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**#219A-** Councilwoman Christodaro offered the following resolution and moved its adoption; seconded by Councilman Barry:

WHEREAS, the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Greece (the "Town"), Monroe County, New York, intends to replace ±525 linear feet of sheet pile seawall with ±525 linear feet of rip-rap shoreline protection at the state-owned, Town-operated public marina (AKA Westpoint Marina), located at Braddock Bay Park, 105 East Manitou Road, Hilton, New York 14468 (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the public marina at Braddock Bay Park is owned by the New York State Department of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (the "NYSOPRHP"), and is operated by the Town under an Agreement of Lease recorded in the New York State Department of State (the "NYSDOS") on April 8, 1981 in Volume 23 of Miscellaneous Deeds and Title Papers at page 39. Pursuant to the Terms and Conditions of such agreement, the Town is requesting written permission from the NYSOPRHP to proceed with the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Town is making application to the NYSOPRHP Environmental Protection Fund Grants Program to assist in financing design and construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Town is submitting permit applications to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (the "NYSDEC"), the NYSDOS, and the United States Army Corps of Engineers (the "USACE") for the Project, including but not limited to a project narrative, conceptual plans, and Part 1 of an Environmental Assessment Form (the "EAF"), which was prepared in part by using the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation NYSDEC EAF Mapper online application; (collectively, the "Application"); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that the Project is subject to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (New York State Environmental Conservation Law, Article 8) and its implementing regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617, the "SEQRA Regulations") (collectively, "SEQRA"), and that the Project constitutes an Unlisted action under SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board intends to become the lead agency for the coordinated environmental review of the Project because potential impacts from the Project primarily would be of local significance; and

WHEREAS, in order to establish a lead agency for coordinated environmental review of the Project, the Town Board requests that all involved agencies reply as soon as possible about whether they agree with the designation of the Town Board as the lead agency for the Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §617.6(b)(3)(i) of the SEQRA Regulations, the Town Board will assume that it has received consent to become the lead agency if an involved agency does not send a written objection within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of filing a Notice of Intent to Become Lead Agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby makes the following determinations:

1. The Town Board intends to become the lead agency for the coordinated environmental review of the Project.
2. The Town Board hereby provides an opportunity of thirty (30) days from the date on which a Notice of Intent to Become Lead Agency is distributed to involved agencies for written comment on the Town Board's intent to become lead agency.
3. If after thirty (30) days' time an involved agency has not provided a written objection to the Town Board becoming lead agency, the Town Board shall assume that it has such involved agency's consent.
4. The Town Board hereby directs Town staff to file a Notice of Intent to Become Lead Agency with all involved agencies, and to notify all such involved agencies of the deadline for acceptance of written objections to the Town Board's intent, in accordance with SEQRA.
5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
