WHEREAS, the Town of Greece (the "Applicant/Project Sponsor") has submitted a request to the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Greece, Monroe County, New York (the "Town") for a waiver of the requirements of Chapter 83 of the Code of the Town of Greece (Coastal Erosion Hazard Area) to replace or install fourteen (14) storm sewer outfalls in the beach and near shore area of a Natural Protective Feature, in various locations north of Lake Shore Drive, as part of the New York State Resiliency and Economic Development Initiative (REDI) Project MO-02, Lake Shore Drive Storm Sewers; and

WHEREAS, having considered carefully all relevant documentary, testimonial, and other evidence submitted, the Town Board makes the following findings:

1. In summary, the Applicant's proposal (the "Proposal") is to replace or install fourteen (14) storm sewer outfalls in the beach and near shore area of a Natural Protective Feature, in various locations north of Lake Shore Drive.
2. In making its determination, the Town Board took into consideration that the strict application of the standards and restrictions of Chapter 83 may cause practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship. When this can be shown, such standards and restrictions may be varied or modified, provided that the following criteria are met:
  - No reasonable, prudent, alternative site is available. No reasonable, prudent, or alternative site is available for the proposed outfalls. The project includes the replacement of existing outfalls that are already part of an existing storm sewer system. Furthermore, the installation of new outfalls will allow for the discharging of stormwater

into Lake Ontario, as opposed to private property or land under the jurisdiction of New York State.

- All responsible means and measures to mitigate adverse impacts on natural systems and their functions and values have been incorporated into the activities design at the property owner's expense. Measures to mitigate adverse impacts on natural systems and their functions have been incorporated into the Proposal. The proposed outfalls and the overall project are subject to state and federal environmental review and permitting, where required. Furthermore, outfalls will be installed in areas that they have historically been present.
- The development will be reasonably safe from flood and erosion damage. The proposed development will be reasonably safe from flood and erosion damage. The purpose of this project is to provide relief to the storm sewer system on Lake Shore Drive and prevent flooding of the street during severe weather events. In terms of erosion damage, this area has seen additional erosion protection structures constructed/installed due elevated lake levels in 2017 and 2019.
- The variance requested is the minimum necessary to overcome the practical difficulty or hardship which was the basis for the requested variance. The request is the minimum necessary to overcome the practical difficulty or hardship which was the basis for this request. The Proposal includes the replacement of infrastructure in an existing storm sewer system. In areas that will include the installation of new outfalls, the overall footprint of said outfalls is minimal, being 30 square feet each.
- Where public funds are utilized, the public benefits must clearly outweigh the long-term adverse effects. The public benefits outweigh the long-term adverse effects. This Proposal's purpose is to provide relief to the town-owned storm sewer on Lake Shore Drive. During elevated water levels, which this street experienced in 2017 and 2019, the sewer system had the potential of reaching capacity, and by doing so preventing the use of the street by residents, emergency workers, and town officials. The purpose of this Proposal is to prevent that type of situation.

RESOLVED that, based on the aforementioned information, testimony, documentation, and findings, Pursuant to the provisions of Article 34 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law and § 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, and pursuant to the Code of the Town of Greece, New York, Chapter 83 (Coastal Erosion Hazard Area), the request submitted by the Town of Greece (the "Applicant/Project Sponsor") to the Town Board (the "Town Board") of the Town of Greece, Monroe County, New York (the "Town") for a waiver of the requirements of Chapter 83 of the Code of the Town of Greece (Coastal Erosion Hazard Area) to replace or install fourteen (14) storm sewer outfalls in the beach and near shore area of a Natural Protective Feature, in various locations north of Lake Shore Drive, as part of the New York State Resiliency and Economic Development Initiative (REDI) Project MO-02, Lake Shore Drive Storm Sewers, is hereby approved.



Section 1. Part I, Chapter 6, Department of Development Services, of the code of the Town of Greece is hereby amended as follows:

**Chapter 6 Planning and Economic Development, Department of**

**§ 6-1 Establishment.**

There is hereby established in the Town of Greece, pursuant to the provisions of the Suburban Town Law and the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York, a department to be known as the "Department of Planning and Economic Development of the Town of Greece."

**§ 6-2 Divisions.**

Said Department shall include the following divisions: the Office of Planning and Zoning, the Office of Community Development, and the Office of Economic Development and, hereinafter, any other office or section of the Town government which the Town Board may, from time to time, place under the jurisdiction and control of said Department.

**§ 6-3 Director; deputies; powers and duties.**

Said Department shall undertake and perform such duties and functions as may, from time to time, be assigned thereto by the Town Board of the Town of Greece.

- A. Said Department shall be headed by a Director to be appointed by the Town Board of the Town of Greece, who shall be vested with full authority, direction and control over the Department. Said Director shall exercise and perform such other powers and duties as are prescribed, from time to time, by the Town Board.
- B. The Town Board may appoint such deputies to the Director as it may find necessary for the efficient operation of said Department and prescribe the titles, powers and duties of each. Said deputies shall have the power to act generally for and in place of their principal, and the office of such deputies shall be in the exempt class of the civil service.

**§ 6-4 Additional powers and duties.**

The Director of the Department of Planning and Economic Development and any deputies who may, from time to time, be appointed by the Town Board shall perform the following duties and have the following powers, in addition to any others prescribed by the Town Board:

A. Director.

- (1) He/She shall have jurisdiction and control over the various divisions which are part of this Department, subject to direction from the Town Board.
- (2) He/She shall be responsible for the proper and efficient operation of his/her Department and all of the divisions thereof and coordinating, insofar as possible, the activities of the various divisions under his/her jurisdiction and control.
- (3) He/She shall carry out such other duties and powers as prescribed by the Town Board.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State.
