

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Town Board, Town of Greece, Monroe County held September 18, 2018 at the Town Hall, One Vince Tofany Boulevard, Rochester, New York at 6:00 p.m.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

Supervisor Reilich called upon Councilman Bill Murphy to lead the Town Board in the Pledge of Allegiance. The invocation was provided by Pastor Gary Pfeiffer, Morningstar Christian Fellowship Church.

Supervisor Reilich stated that he had several items to update the residents again this month on various Town projects and programs. The following is the Supervisor's transcript on these particular projects and programs for the Town of Greece residents' information:

**INNOVATIONS IN OUR TAX DEPARTMENT**

"We have made several upgrades to customer service in our Receiver of Taxes office. Receiver Andy Conlon and I were pleased to have had installed a night drop box. This drop box is available to all of our residents to use after hours (or during the day if they do not have time to stop in). We collect CHECKS only as payment for your tax bills and all payments that are received prior to the office opening at 9:00 am will be posted toward the prior's days business.

The start of the school tax collections has been much smoother as many of our residents have opted to take advantage of the drop box.

Additionally, we are pleased to be able to offer our residents the option of using a credit card to pay their taxes. We accept all types of credit cards as well as paypal for transactions. We advertised widely about the service and also informed those wishing to take advantage of the credit card service that we must pass the bank cost for processing the transaction to the residents. The fee is 3% for any wishing to use their credit card to pay their taxes and we are currently trying to negotiate for a better rate for upcoming taxing seasons. To ensure everyone is well aware of this fee – we advertised it in the Greece Post in our original announcement, it is on my facebook page – the town facebook page and there is abundant signage at the counter as well. Additionally, the resident must confirm on our charge screen their acknowledgement of the 3% fee. So far we have had a good number of people take advantage of this new feature as well.

**INNOVATIONS IN OUR CLERK'S OFFICE**

New requirements by the Federal Government for enhanced licenses for travel presented a need by our residents needing these license to have access to their marriage licenses. I'd like to thank our Clerk, Cheryl Rozzi for working with me and our IT department to cut the effort required by our residents in half.

Cheryl has worked to have the required form available on line – much the same way as our FOIL requests come through. This eliminates the need for someone to come into town hall to pick up the form necessary to request their marriage license search, the next step was to come back to submit the paperwork and pay the required research fee. The individual would then need to come back to town hall and pick up their documentation. This new plan – allows residents to fill out and submit their paperwork – they then stop into town hall to pay and pick up their marriage license.

I have always stressed that we need to embrace technology and find ways to think outside of the box – all of these new innovations are doing just that.

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### **FREE SHREDDING EVENT**

We held our second free shredding event of the year – I partnered with our Receiver and our town board members to once again bring this free service to our residents – we plan to offer this service twice a year – once earlier in the day – the second later in the evening to try to make it as convenient as possible and at no cost – estimates are that a normal household would pay in the neighborhood of \$50 for this shredding service individually.

### **STORY WALK**

Many thanks again to the Friends of the Greece Public Library and our Parks and Recreation Staff. A new story walk has been installed in the pathway around our spray park and retention pond. This walk around book will be changed out several times a year. What a great way to integrate a nice walk in the great outdoors with a good book. If you haven't visited it yet – I invite you to make a stop out with your children or grandchildren.

### **FLU CLINICS**

Once again we are happy to partner with Flu Prevention Partners (Workplace Vitality) and Walgreens to offer flu clinics right here at town hall campus – we have several clinics scheduled all are available on my facebook page, the town website and the Greece Post as well as out on our sign board where we will post each event.

### **UPDATE ON VACANT HOMES**

The Town of Greece is known for being very aggressive with our vacant home process. We have the strictest codes, we have more employees in the department than ever before and we are making a difference. Just as an example in 2017 we had 199 vacant properties in town – this is out of over 33,000 parcels of residential homes. We currently sit at only 108 – and 40 of these are in the works to move from vacant to welcoming a new family. Also for the first time ever we are actually seeing banks start to “flip” homes where as before they were not interested in the investment. Only 108 Homes are left and most are classified as stagnant – this is typically because the cost of the liens on the property far exceed the actual value of the property. These are perhaps the most time consuming and despite our efforts with maintenance we do not control their destiny.

Another interesting fact – during the last year we performed over 1,225 site inspections to these properties alone. A special thank you to our code enforcement team for all of their diligence on addressing the issues with these vacant homes.”

### **PROCLAMATIONS, ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS TO AGENDA:**

Supervisor Reilich, in addition to the Town Board, awarded several proclamations. The first proclamation was awarded to Dylan Austin on achieving the rank of Eagle Scout for his project on cleaning up a section of Holy Sepulchre Cemetary.

The second was awarded to Niayah Blair as recognition of being the first woman to complete the Monroe Manufacturers Job Program. She is the first woman mold making apprentice at her company, Romold, Inc. as well as in New York State.

Lastly, Chief Patrick Phelan provided the Oath of Office to the newest Greece police officer - Daniel Eichas.
